

Junior Expedition Teams Athlete Code of Conduct

The following code of conduct represents a code of behavior for all of our athletes. The code reflects a commitment to, athletic achievement on the mountain, and citizenship in the community. We require that each athlete accept and abide by the code. Each Athlete and a parent must sign a copy of this code, which will then become an agreement between JETS, the athlete, and the parents.

General Code of Conduct

1. JETS athletes will maintain high standards and ethical behavior, which includes self control, responsible behavior, consideration for other's physical and emotional well being, courtesy, good manners, and sportsmanship at all times. This includes all other program participants, and the general public that is skiing or riding at Kirkwood or any other resort.
2. JETS athletes must show respect to coaches, parents, ski area facilities, and the guests and employees of JETS at all times.
3. JETS athletes will be respectful of teammates' space, belongings and feelings.
4. JETS athletes must not use profane language or engage in disruptive behavior at team activities.
5. JETS athletes will be respectful of all coaches, parents, officials, volunteers, spectators, and other participants.
6. JETS athletes must maintain a healthy lifestyle.
7. JETS athletes must be honest and truthful in all they endeavor.
8. JETS athletes must abide by the FIS, USSA, USASA, and JETS series rules of competition and Codes of Conduct in all events entered.
9. JETS athletes are representatives of Kirkwood Mountain Resort and JETS and must act accordingly.
10. JETS athletes must know and abide by the Responsibility Code.
11. JETS athletes will not commit criminal acts while representing the program at home or away competition.
12. JETS athletes may not ski or snowboard within a CLOSED Ski Area Boundary.
13. JETS athletes may not leave the scene if involved in a collision, except to notify authorities or obtain assistance.

Skier/Snowboarder Responsibility Code

1. Stay in control.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way, you must be able to stop or avoid them.
3. Stop in a safe place for you and others.
4. When starting downhill or merging, look uphill and yield.
5. Use devices to prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe all signs and warnings, and keep off closed trails and areas.
7. Before riding the chairlift, you must know how to load, ride, and unload safely.

This is a partial list. Be safety conscious.
